JACKIE ROBINSON: A GAME APART

It's a glimpse into baseball legend Jackie Robinson's life during a bygone era of separate and unequal locker rooms, whites-only hotels and restaurant back doors. Witness the hopeless humiliation of a star player showered with adulation on the field but a second-hand citizen outside the stadium. Meet his compatriots fighting the same battles between end zones, inside the ring and around the track. A Game Apart is a powerful lesson of courage through dedication, perseverance and leadership. 50 min.; adaptable for students from grades 2+ and general audiences.



• BROWN VS. BOARD OF EDUCATION: OVER FIFTY YEARS LATER

In 1952, the Supreme Court heard a number of school segregation cases, including Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka, Kansas. It ruled unanimously in 1954 that segregation was unconstitutional, overthrowing Plessy v. Ferguson (1896), which set the "separate but equal" precedent. This play recounts the effects of the decision on the families who participated in the original court case, the impact of the ruling on school systems at the time and the challenges still being made today. 50 min.; recommended for grades 6+ and general audiences.



• TIRED SOULS: THE MONTGOMERY BUS BOYCOTT

50 min.; grades 3+ and general audiences.

Montgomery, AL, Dec. 1, 1955: Rosa Parks refuses to give up her seat to a white man on a city bus. This action inspires the black citizens of Montgomery to abandon all travel on city buses until they are no longer forced to sit in the back or stand when a white person boards. There were more who came before, brave visionaries who laid the groundwork for this pivotal moment. Tired Souls introduces audiences to Jo Ann Robinson, Claudette Colvin and others instrumental in the Civil Rights movement, changing the course of U.S. history forever.
